Why NOT to Use R for Teaching


- Too difficult for students

Can **Course Evaluations** Help Us Determine Whether or Not To Teach R in Undergraduate Methods Courses?


- Emily Panzarella analyzed recent teaching evaluations from my 2021 courses
- The "unit" of analysis is each statement from the evaluations regarding the use R
 - In total, there were 521 statements regarding the use of R from the evaluations
- I will focus on statements regarding the difficulty of R, liking of R, interest in learning R, and the value of R

Is Learning R Difficult?







Do Students Like Learning R?
